**1. Welcome & Introductions**

**2&3 Minutes of last meeting & matters arising**

The minutes are accepted as a true record of the last meeting.

- 4. Correspondence** - Letter from VOSA to Cllr Rooney re the issues with Stagecoach. WDCF welcome this letter as it has pushed Stagecoach who is more proactive and situation has improved slightly.

**5. Presentations**

**Carl Mullooly (Sheffield Homes)** - Copy of Carl's presentation available on request.

- 2 weeks worth of diary sheets are probably all that is required but to secure an eviction more may be needed.
- Doesn't have to be Sheffield Homes' diary sheets - resident's own diary sheets are acceptable.
- Any tracking between anti-social teams and housing? Majority of cases are not re-housed.
- Sheffield Homes will deal with issues concerning Council Tenants but 101 service is available to all residents.

**Inspector Jason Booth** - Following on from Carl's presentation Jason reports that information on Police Action will be reported to Sheffield Homes so that action can be speeded up.

- Mobile Police Station will be in the village on 24<sup>th</sup> May to find out the local's views and it is important to get people involved as not all incidents are reported.
- The Police Surgeries will be advertised and posters will be put up.
- Mauncer - only 3 minor issues reported (no privacy at pharmacist, kids playing football and a missing street sign).
- DPPO used power 13 times and word has now got out.
- Sheffield Homes and St. Annes will be informed of any problems with residents.
- Radio Hallam is reporting the first Order outside a City Centre.
- Local businesses have said it is great.
- Trouble on Tannery Park moved away.
- People have been accosted outside Costcutter to buy alcohol.
- Ray Satur - Councillors will be supporting the excellent work by Police which should be continued.
- Has problem just moved? Have always had young people drinking in parks but need to try to change the culture of drinking.

- Scrap metal people some are thieves with no licences. Operation Rapier stopped 21 and seized 2 vehicles, 1 arrest and 1 prohibition notice issued.
- Bogus officials - do not let people in your house.
- Incident in the underpass is an ongoing case so cannot comment but usually people are not attacked without a reason.
- RS - We must take care not to frighten people of Woodhouse as it is a nice place to live.

**Wendy Zealand (Neighbourhood Watch)** - Wendy gave an overview of Neighbourhood Watch. Discussed the telephone preference service, smart water (a way of marking items with a chemical code), and how to become a co-ordinator.

### **(a) Project Development**

The newsletter is being printed and should be distributed before the 18<sup>th</sup> June in time for the Family Fun Day on the Tannery Lodge site.

Samantha Butler would like to thank the Forum members for allowing her to take photographs of activities. Her display is in the Library to view.

Kathryn is in the process of completing a tender for a share of the Adult Learning provision grant for September 2011. This bid requires an insurance indemnity of £2 million which is over and above what we and our insurance company feel is necessary for the service we are delivering.

RS - Are you able to buy into corporate insurance from organisations such as Sheffield Homes? Councillors want the bidding process to favour small organisations. This seems to discourage local organisations to move forward.

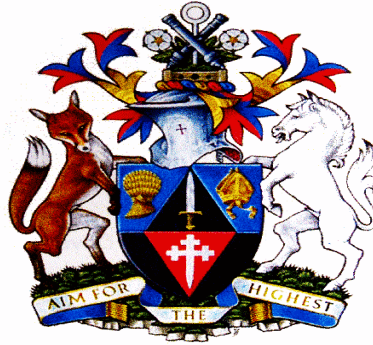
**(b) Publicity** -Peter gave a comprehensive list of engagements in March and April.
